

## **SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR UGRC COURSES**

1. A student taking Level 200 Political Science should not take **UGRC 222: Africa in the Contemporary World**.
2. A student taking Level 200 Music, Drama, Dance and Bachelor of Fine Art (BFA) should not take:
  - a. **UGRC 225: African Dance**
  - b. **UGRC 226: African Drama**
  - c. **UGRC 227: African Music**
3. Under no circumstances should a student register for **more than one UGRC AFRICAN STUDIES** courses. Examination papers for students who violate this regulation will automatically be cancelled.
4. Only students who have duly registered for the UGRC courses will be allowed to write examinations in those courses.
5. Students who are willing to take the following Language Proficiency courses will have to **Register at the Institute of African Studies**:

6. Students in higher levels who do not have access should send their detailed academic records to their respective College Academic Offices.
7. UGRC120 (Numeracy Skills) is for all students in the College of Humanities except those offering Bsc Administration, Economics, Computer Science, Mathematics and Statistics.
8. **UGRC170 (General Mathematics)** is for students offering Economics without Mathematics.
9. UGRC160 (Introduction to Literature) is for students in the College of Humanities offering BSc Administration, Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Science.
10. Students offering both **Mathematics and Economics** are advised to choose **UGRC160 (Introduction to Literature)**
